Michigan Transfer Network

An automated transfer equivalency information system for Michigan students



Where did the idea originate?

The MTN idea grew out of a number of separate initiatives





- MACRAO Transfer Agreement (1970-1972)
- MACRAO ESCALATE Project (late1980's)
- Cherry Commission Report
 (...must create by 2006 a statewide "transfer wizard" website....)
- Meeting with Michigan Senators
 (Senators Michael Switalski and Deborah Cherry)
- MACRAO's desire to continue to be at the forefront of transfer articulation in the state of Michigan

Strategic Planning



Creating the MTN

- MACRAO Executive Committee creates Ad-hoc Committee.
- Ad-hoc Committee creates draft of charge, objective, definition, specifications for phases, and time line.

The Big Three



(We're from Michigan after all!)

- Ad-hoc Committee Wisdom & Work Ethic.
- Transparency.
- Buy-in.

Ad-hoc Committee Wisdom & Work Ethic



- Careful selection of members required:
 - A history of dedication to transfer issues and MACRAO.
 - Finishers.
 - Balance for credibility.
 (Type & size of institution. Admissions & Registration.)

Transparency

(Code for Strategic Planning.)



- Taking the MTN to the streets. (Communication)
- Feedback loop. (The heart of strategic planning.)
- Web site with background info, meeting minutes, and specs.
- Anyone who didn't know about the MTN, had to try not to know about the MTN.

Buy-in



- Transparency with a twist.
 (Continuous improvement, but sign-up now!)
- Ease of use. (For students and administration.)
- Why should my college sign-up? (What if you don't?)
- Cost. (Free!)
- Creditability. (Foundation is a partnership.)

What does it do?



A Very Basic Definition

The goal of the MTN project is to provide a centralized web based system that would allow any student who has taken a course at any Michigan College or University to see how that course would transfer to any other Michigan College or University.

Who can participate?



Any college or university in Michigan that has institutional MACRAO membership



TimeLine



- February 2007:
 - Signed contract with Michigan State University
- Feb to March 31:
 Alpha Schools recruited for testing
- April 1 to Nov 7:
 Beta schools uploading and testing
- November 8, 2007:
 The Michigan Transfer Network goes live!


Who is participating?



As of March 1st:

- 55 Participating Schools
- 47 Have uploaded equivalencies
 - **22** Community Colleges
 - 13 Public 4 year or Graduate
 - 12 Private Colleges and Universities

Total Equivalencies Uploaded: 691,920



Implementation Plans



Phase I Live!

- Basic lookup ability for students
- Encourage college and university participation
- Provide help and consultation for loading equivalencies

Phase II

Planned

- Students able to create a file and "save" their courses for future use
- Add CLEP and AP, out of state schools

Phase III

 Compare courses taken to academic program requirements, transfer guides or a very basic degree audit system

How does it work?



- We have created a centralized database of transfer equivalencies to which we all contribute.
- The viewing and updating of the database is all done in a web application, accessible via a link from the MACRAO Michigan College Mall or direct via:

www.MichiganTransferNetwork.org

Guiding Principles



- Upload/Update of information should be easy may not have technical staff supplying/updating the data.
- Schools should be able to update any/all of their data, including school colors, logos, etc. in web application – no maintenance on the back end.
- The database needed to be flexible enough to hold transfer equivalencies on a many-to-many basis – meaning one or more courses can transfer as a "group" to the "home" institution as one or more courses.
- While common subject/course numbering wasn't necessary, common institution codes were – didn't want multiple listings for schools (MSU, Michigan State, Michigan State University, etc.). Used IPEDS Institution Code.
- Student interface should be as clean and uncluttered as possible
 Keep it simple!

Behind the Scenes



- 2 Web Servers, 1 SQL server
- 5 data tables:
 - Institution Information: Institution Name, Web site, colors, image, etc.
 - User Information: User Name, User ID, Email, password, etc.
 - Equivalency Map: Key, Home Institution Code, Transfer Institution Code, Equivalency Comments, Last Update
 - Home Institution Courses: Key, Subject, Course, Title, Credits, General Credits, Waive Credits
 - Transfer Institution Courses: Key, Subject, Course, Credits
- Various logs and other miscellaneous tables used during upload

Data Input/Upload



- Authorized users can manually add/update equivalencies in a web form or upload a text file.
- File Upload:
 - Basic text formats: CSV (comma-separated values, comma delimited) or Vertical Bar (|) delimited text files accepted
 - Three formats:
 - Simple: used by schools with simple, one-to-one equivalencies only and can easily be created in a spreadsheet.
 - Simple Expanded: used by schools with more complex equivalencies and can be created in a spreadsheet.
 - Multiple: used by most schools, can accept one-to-one, as well as many-to-many (no limit) equivalencies.
 - Safety measures:
 - If upload of new data fails, prior data not deleted.
 - User can upload all data in one file (all prior equivalency data is deleted) or one or more transfer institutions at a time (prior equivalency data for the uploaded transfer institutions is deleted).
- Data Deletion can occur through the manual interface after input/upload or by uploading a new file.

Uploading Tips




- Build a "crosswalk" from school's institution codes to the IPEDS codes.
- Decide whether to load only current equivalencies no history in the system (no term parameters).
- Ask technical staff for help writing the program to create the text file
 once written, you can just run as needed to pull fresh data.
- Due to comma and quote "issues", vertical bar delimited file is highly recommended.
- If upload errors, view file in simple text viewer like Notepad.
 Programs like MS Excel don't actually let you view the file as it is and may be hiding "issues".
- Ask other similar SIS schools for help!

Majority of schools loading via upload. 40,000+ records can be loaded in less than 1minute.

Institution Information

MAC RAO

Participating Institutions can update their own information, set their school colors, and upload a logo for display on the site.







- Simple and Smart Drop-Down Lists: Loaded only from good, existing data. For example, when searching by Receiving Institution:
 - Receiving Institution List consists only of participating institutions with data loaded to system.
 - After Receiving Institution selected, Subject, Course, and Transfer Institution choices loaded "on the fly" with only valid data.

 Students access the MTN through the Michigan College Mall, MACRAO web site or:

- Students select the institution where they have taken courses
- Students select course from a drop-down
- Students select the institution (or "all") for which they desire equivalency information





Student wants to know what course to take to fulfill a MSU Accounting 201 requirement:







The output is information from the "receiving" institution - the equivalency for the course (or courses) that they have selected and any comments or notes pertaining to the equivalencies.
