#### 150 Portuguese for Speakers of Other

Romance Languages I Fall. 4(4-0) RB: Solid background in another Romance language Not open to students with credit in PRT 101 or PRT 102. Development of listening, speaking, reading, writing skills, and cultural knowledge.

#### 201 Second-Year Portuguese I

Fall. 4(4-0) P: PRT 102 Intermediate level review and development of aural comprehension, speaking, reading, and writing skills. Topics in the cultures of the Portuguese-speaking world.

#### 202 Second-Year Portuguese II

Spring. 4(4-0) P: PRT 201 Further review and development of aural comprehension, speaking, reading, and writing skills. Topics in the cultures of the Portuguese-speaking world.

### 250 Portuguese for Speakers of Other Romance Languages II

Spring. 4(4-0) P: PRT 150 or PRT 102 RB: Solid background in another Romance language Not open to students with credit in PRT 201 or PRT 202.

Continued development of listening, speaking, read-ing, writing skills, and cultural knowledge.

Fall, Spring. 1 to 4 credits. A student may earn a maximum of 4 credits in all enroll-ments for this course. R: Approval of department.
