Other academic information:

The program is designed for students majoring in German who have chosen the third year business language track (GRM 311-312). Specializing in engineering and business, UAS offers a strong focus on international business language and business administration. Course offerings cover the entire spectrum of business management and economics and offer students the chance to study German and international business.

In addition to German-specific courses in business management, UAS offers a series of international management courses. Many of these courses are offered in English. Students will be required to take a minimum of twelve (12), maximum of eighteen (18) credits during the program.

This program runs during spring semester only. The semester lasts 6 months; however, lectures are only held during 4-5 months. The last month is reserved for final exams or final projects, depending on course requirements. The spring semester (called "summer semester" in Germany) runs from mid March to June/July.

Class organization in Germany takes the form of lecture, exercise, seminar or laboratory (practical). During the semester there is usually no homework assigned, except in language courses. The grade received is based on one final exam or project
