Explanations:

ETH Zurich deploys a grading scale of 6.0 to 1.0, divided into quarter grades; 6.0 is the highest and 1.0 the lowest grade. The performance assessment is passed if it receives a grade of 4.0 or higher.

Credit conversion is based on a course-by-course basis. Not based on the sum of credit earned.

The ETH Zurich credit system is based upon the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS). One credit corresponds to an average student workload of 30 hours. Acquiring credits is always subject to passing an examination. Special rules apply to doctoral studies.

MSU credit conversion is based on ECTS credits. ECTS stands for European Credit Transfer System and provides a way of measuring and comparing learning achievements, and transferring them from one institution to another. ECTS credits are a relative value. The ECTS credit is 50% of the US credit value: i.e., $\text{ECTS credits} \times \frac{1}{2} = \text{MSU credits}$. In ECTS, 60 credit points represent the workload of a year of study, 30 credit points are allocated to a semester and 20 credit points to a term. If a course yields credits resulting in partial MSU credit (e.g., 1.5 MSU credits), it is rounded up to the next full credit (e.g., 2 MSU credits).
