MSU COLLEGE OF LAW

LAW 501N	Sales and Secured Transactions On Demand. 0 to 6 credits. R: Open to Law students in the MSU College of Law. Not open to students with credit in LAW 501E or LAW 501F.
NEW	The course will provide an overview of Articles 2 and 9 of the Uniform Commercial Code, including title, risk of loss, UCC remedies, attachment and perfection of security interests, and priority battles among secured creditors. Effective Fall 2021
LAW 535S	Cybersecurity and Data Protection On Demand. 0 to 6 credits. R: Open to Law students in the MSU College of Law or in the MSU College of Law.
NEW	An introduction to current issues in cybersecurity and data protection to give a solid foundation for working within current and future data protection frameworks and laws. Effective Fall 2021
LAW 580A	Campaign Finance & Regulation On Demand. 0 to 6 credits. R: Open to Law students in the MSU College of Law.
NEW	Rules, regulations and relevant case law governing the campaign finance system at the state and federal levels. Effective Spring 2022
LAW 593D	Remedies Fall of every year. Spring of every year. Summer of every year. 1 to 4 credits. P: LAW 500D <u>P: LAW 530B</u> R: Open to students in the MSU College of Law. Overview of main types of remedies available in the American legal system following a determination of liability for violation of contract, tort, property or constitutional law. Covers monetary damages, equitable relief, and examines the implications of choosing particular remedies. SA: DCL 423 Effective Fall 2009 <u>Effective Fall 2021</u>
LAW 609A	Sports and Inequality On Demand. 0 to 6 credits. R: Open to Law students in the MSU College of Law.
NEW	This seminar will examine legal and social implications of discrimination in both professional and amateur sports. Legal efforts to address discrimination in sports based on characteristics such as race, gender, disability, and sexual orientation will be discussed. Effective Spring 2022
LAW 811F	Food Regulatory Law: Counseling and Advocacy On Demand. 0 to 6 credits. R: Open to Law students in the MSU College of Law. Not open to students with credit in FSC 820 or LAW 810U.
NEW	This class introduces students to and applies a knowledge of administrative law and regulatory principles, and food law to develop advocacy and counseling knowledge and skills relevant to food law and the food industry. Effective Fall 2021

HST 418	History and Art through Technology Fall of every year. 3(3-0) Interdepartmental with History of Art. P: (HST 201 or HST 251 or HA 101 or HA 210) and completion of Tier I writing requirement R: Not open to freshmen.
NEW	Approaches in History and Art History to visual, material, textual, and other historical sources using digital technologies to explore a particular region, time period, or thematic topic. Effective Fall 2021

HRLR 494 Undergraduate Research in Human Capital and Society
Fall of every year. Spring of every year. Summer of every year. ~~3 to 6 credits.~~ 1 to 6 credits. A student may earn a maximum of 8 credits in all enrollments for this course. P: HRLR 201 and (HRLR 315 or concurrently) R: Open to undergraduate students in the College of Social Science or approval of school. Not open to students with credit in SSC 494.
